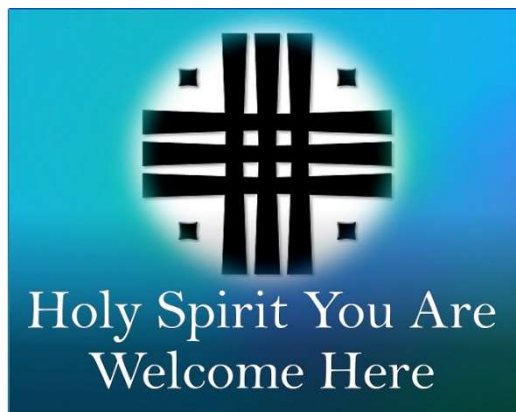

Dr. Kim Childs, Professor of Choral Studies and Voice at the University of Tulsa, directs the Cappella Chamber Singers, TU Chorale, and teaches choral conducting, choral conducting seminar (which involves real time choral conducting by student conductors), choral literature, and private voice.

The Cappella Chambers Singers under the direction of Dr. Childs has been featured at Carnegie Hall, a winner in Oklahoma Centennial concerts, featured Brown Bag-It Series at the Tulsa PAC, and also the prestigious Bernsen Concert Series at First Presbyterian Church, among others. Childs has conducted the Duruflé *Requiem* and *Messe Cum Jubilo*, Mozart *Requiem*, Britten *Rejoice in the Lamb* and *Ceremony of Carols*, Pinkham *Christmas Cantata*, Vivaldi *Gloria*, Handel *Messiah*, Mozart *Coronation Mass*, Fauré *Requiem*, Gustav Mahler *Symphony No 2 in C Minor*, and many other major choral works. He has studied conducting with Dr. Joe Miller of Westminster Choir College, Simon Carrington at the Norfolk Chamber Music Festival, Jerry McCoy, past President of the American Choral Directors Association, and Deanna Joseph, Director of Choral Activities at Georgia State University. Each year Dr. Childs brings noted conductors and national clinicians

to the University of Tulsa such as Z. Randall Stroope of Oklahoma State University; Jerry McCoy of University of North Texas; Dr. Joshua Oppenheim, Kansas State University; Daniel Bara, University of Georgia; Dr. Julie Yu Oppenheim, Kansas State University; Dr. Deanna Joseph, Georgia State University, and others. Voice and Choral Conducting students of Dr. Childs have gone on to national graduate programs.

Dr. Childs is a sought-after tenor soloist with recent performances including Ralph Vaughan Williams *Hodie* and *Ten Blake Songs* and Handel's *Messiah* with the Tulsa Chorale and Tulsa Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Childs' degrees were obtained at Oral Roberts University, Southern Methodist University and the University of North Texas.

Dr. David Cherwien, music director of the National Lutheran Choir, is a nationally known conductor, composer, and organist. Recognized for his contributions to the field of church music and liturgy, he is in demand as a clinician and hymn festival leader across the country.

David serves as the editor of the National Lutheran Choir Series of choral music published by Morningstar Music Publishers. He is a founding member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians and has served in its leadership in a variety of capacities, including as National President from 1993 to 1997. David is a member of the American Choral Director's Association, American Guild of Organists, Chorus America, and Choristers Guild.

In addition, David serves as Cantor at Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, a parish known for its passion for creative high-quality liturgy and music.

Dr. Cherwien holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance and the Master of Arts degree in Theory and Composition from the University of Minnesota. In the fall of 2000, he was honored as a "Distinguished Alumnus" by Augsburg College, Minneapolis, where he studied choral music education and organ performance as an undergraduate. David also spent two years at the Berlin Church Music School studying conducting, composition and organ.

Nancy Krause has been a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Oklahoma City since 1981 where she currently serves as the Director of Music Ministry, a position she has held since 1993. Prior to joining the church staff, Nancy provided music education since the mid 80's to the teenagers at St. Paul's as a volunteer director of singing and ringing. She currently directs the church's adult choir and two handbell ensembles. Nancy also serves as the Director of the St. Paul's Fine Arts Academy, a not-for-profit agency that provides music instruction in multiple disciplines.

The St. Paul's Music Ministry has recorded two CD's that feature all choirs in the church. Nancy's adult choir members have sung in Lincoln Center in NYC as well as on tour in Germany, Austria and the Czech Republic. The local AGO chapter in Oklahoma City asked St. Paul's handbell ministry to provide a concert for their 2010 concert series that featured music for handbells and organ as a way to introduce the church's new pipe organ to the AGO community. Her Canticle Ringers advanced handbell choir has played many concerts both for the church and outside the church, including as guests of Oklahoma City's professional choir, Canterbury Voices, on their Christmas with Canterbury concerts in 2009 and 2016. They also played for the 20th anniversary of the OKC Bombing Service, for two Oklahoma Alliance for Liturgy and the Arts (OALA) Services of Prayers for Unity, The Ladies Music Club, MacDowell Music Club, as well as participating in a myriad of Handbell Musicians of America festivals and concerts for retirement communities.

Nancy served as a co-conductor of the CORD (Central Oklahoma Ringers and Directors) fall music festival in 2000. A proponent of collaborative events, Nancy has served as chairman of the

Lutheran Musicians of Central Oklahoma organizing multiple choir festivals involving Lutheran choristers from across the OKC metro area participating under various esteemed conductors such as Weston Noble, Craig Arnold, and Z. Randall Stroope. Most humbly, Nancy was honored to have chaired the committee that planned the commemoration service for the 20th anniversary of the OKC Bombing, “We Rise to Bless You Still,” directed by Anton Armstrong and sponsored by OALA.

Nancy was pleased to lead the Handbell portion of the 2018 ADM Conference at OCU and is even more delighted to return this year.
