


GA. He is the organist and Music Director at First Christian Church (DOC).




Beth Miller

New ADM Musician Clinician Fund

established by the Planning Council this summer. With beginning donations totaling \$3,052.00, the new fund, when it reaches \$40,000.00 will help supplement the honorarium paid to handbell, choral or organ clinicians. Modeled after the Tom Wood Worship Clinician fund, this new fund will help defray the cost of another conference clinician each summer. Along with these two clinician funds, ADM also continues to build the Endowment Fund and the Vera Enz First-timers Fund which received respectively during special offerings this summer \$275.00 and \$1,478.00.
